Nobuk Chuck Update:

Chuck and I have just returned from the eye specialist, Dr. Ramasamy. I am afraid that the news is not as good as we had hoped. First off the good news; Chuck's eye has healed well for the time span, however (this is where the bad news starts) scar tissue is causing the Retina to pull away and will need to be surgically fixed. The Dr. says that it will not take as long this time because he doesn't have to deal w/all the blood. He will remove all the silicone liquid, and probably the implant, reattach the Retina and replace the silicone. He is letting the healing continue for a few more weeks before the surgery, in hopes that the Optic nerve will heal and might allow Chuck a little more eyesight. When asked the prognosis, he said, Chuck will probably never see normally out of that eye again. He will be able to see white or grey shapes kinda foggy, but if it doesn't get any clearer after 6 months, that is as good as it gets. There is no surgery to repair the optic nerve. The new surgery will take place on December 13th. So again we ask for your prayers and we thank GOD for all the wonderful gifts he has given us, including all of you.

Until that time we will be offering our Winter League shoots for all of you folks who don't want your barrels to run the risk of cobwebs. Our first Winter League shoot is Dec. 9, 2007. Please remember that we start our W.L. shoots about an hour later than usual, approximately 9:30am with registration, and the first shots go downrange at the pistol building around 10:15am. Remember also you do not need to bring your cart! We have gun racks for your use at the pistol building. Bring your usual amount of ammo as we will have a side-match or two after the regular three stages are shot. We will also offer a sight in period after the side-matches for anyone who needs to make sure your smoke-poles are shooting where you want. If you wish to shoot any other firearms such as double action pistols or semi-autos, I'm sure we could make that happen also.

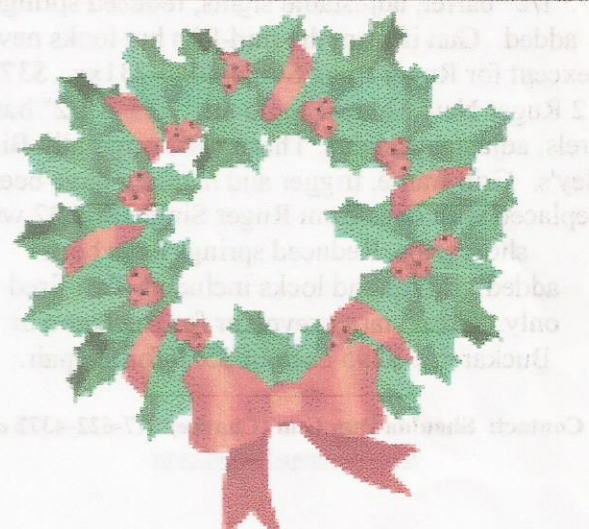
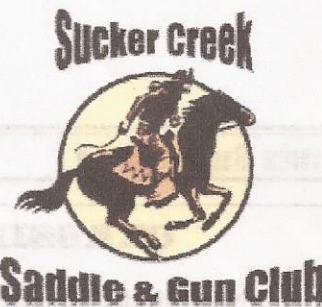


News from out at Sucker Creek
