Rocky River Regulators of DSC (Utica)

Sunday, August 3rd was sunny, hot, and humid; perfect weather for a Wild Bunch match at D.S.C. The competitors shot 5 Wild Bunch stages written by Coyote Claxton, Coyote takes extra time to provide close and far targets, pistol and rifle target options, and lots of run and gun magazine change scenarios. Simply said these are some of the best Wild Bunch stages anywhere. You need to come out and try this type of shooting. I guarantee you will leave with a smile on your face.

Anyway back to the match...when the dust cleared and the scores were tallied the top finisher in the SASS Men's Modern category was D.S.C.'s J.J. Longley. The top SASS Men's Traditional category was Attica Jack. The top SASS Women's Modern category was Hey Sugar and D.S.C.'s Fraser Fox won the D.S.C. Open category.

We do have the SASS sanctioned Wild Bunch classes recognized but if you don't have all the Wild Bunch gear, no problem. We have a D.S.C. open class where you can shoot any caliber CAS lever action rifle and any CAS shotgun you may own. All you need is ANY semi automatic pistol that shoots LEAD bullets and you are ready for a Wild Bunch experience. A typical wild bunch stage could be 20 pistol, 10 rifle, and 6 shotgun. So if you want plenty of shooting and action, this might just be "your cup of tea".

Our next Wild Bunch match is Sunday, October 12, 2014.



On Sunday, August 17th Rocky River was buslin' with shooters looking to warm up for Range War. Fifty cowboys and cowgirls shot 5 furious stages and hit most of

the targets. When the scores were tallied Lefty Wheeler was the top gunslinger for the day. J.J. Longley was the top finisher from D.S.C. Shooting clean matches were J.J., Onyx, Catlow, Briscoe Callaghan, D.S.C.'s Camp-town and Rochester Kid, and Broke N' West.
